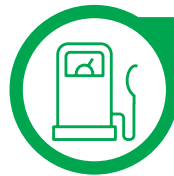

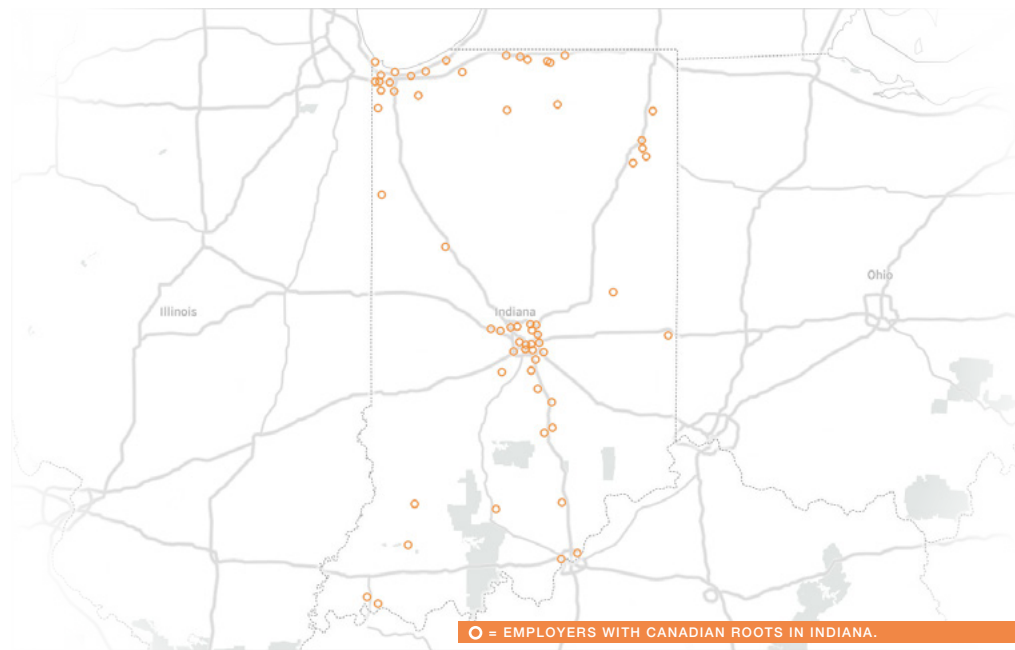

THE U.S.-CANADA PARTNERSHIP
